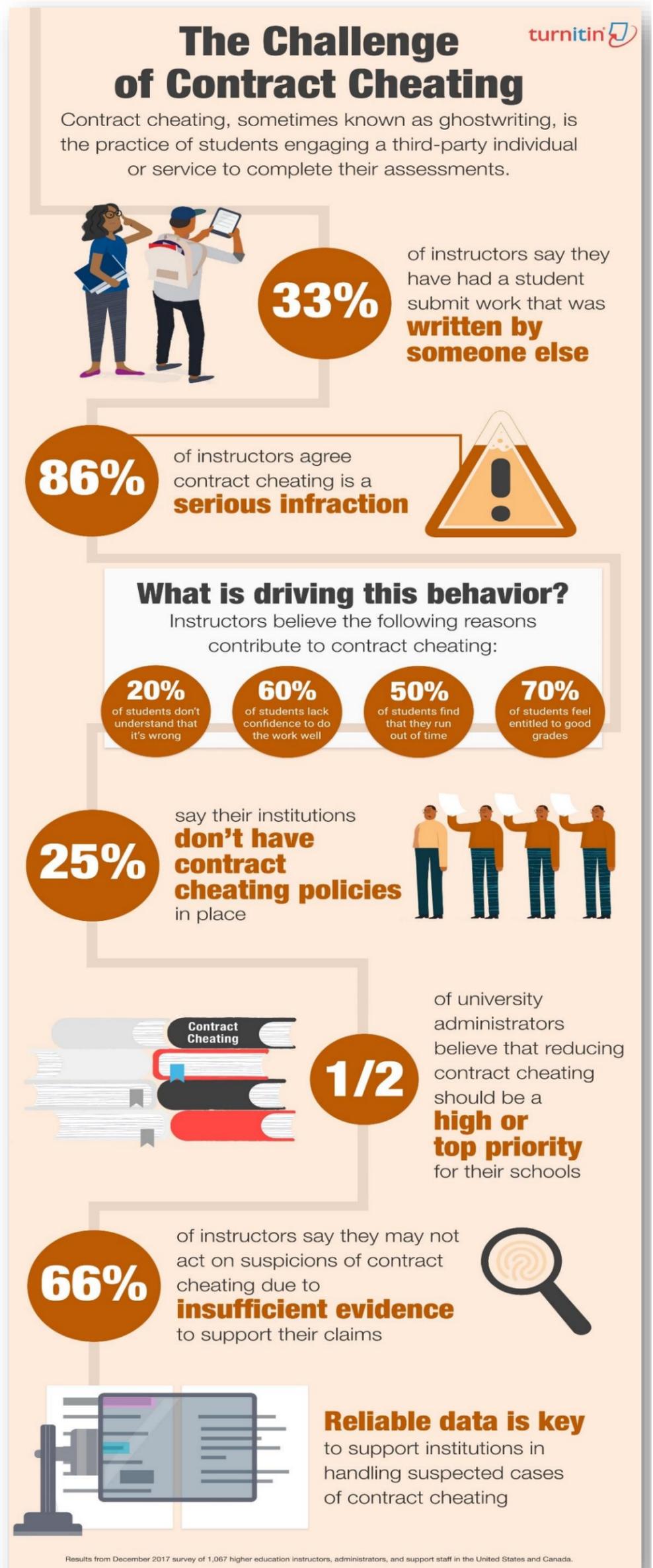

Thus, learners are expected to realize that it is their qualification that is supposed to build their skill set and nurture knowledge, therefore, resorting to unethical means translates as a testament to severe breach of their '*Learner-Teacher-Educational Institution Contract*' that essentially requires them to be dutiful and honest to begin with.

Academic Honesty necessarily does not implicate the values in a human being, in fact like skills, it can be coached and inculcated. The significant aspect being the 'intention' for it. Research has shed some profound light on such behaviour by students as the adjacent infographic exhibits. 

Nevertheless, learners need to be educated and thoroughly briefed about the repercussions that lead to dishonesty in their academic assignments. In order to ensure academic honesty by students, academic institutions share their 'Academic Honesty Policy' to apprise students about what is required of them, stating precisely what are the dire consequences should they fail to abide by them. At TMUC, it is an eminent feature to hold Academic Honesty workshop during the orientation day/week for new learners, that culminates with students signing the policy in person of the same.

At TMUC, we feel that the onus lies jointly on all stakeholders involved but in sequential phases. Being the educational institute, TMUC is to share the requirements, objectives, reasons and repercussions related to Academic Honesty so that the students are fully aware of what is expected of them during the study programmes at TMUC. While the expectation to fulfill the desired then lies on the student from thereon, students are reminded of their commitment by the instructors/teachers. As much as the academic instructors need not emphasise on the authenticity, originality and integrity of the assignments submitted repeatedly, at TMUC, teachers make it a point that learners do not plagiarize, collude or fabricate content that they submit for grading to admonish against any use of unfair means. It is imperative that students need to be conscious of their conduct when it comes to academics and must exhibit academic honesty at all times to avoid any undesirable action against their submissions which usually is failing the course without a second chance.

TMUC has subscribed to Turnitin services for the past 3 years and supporting students and staff with similarity indexes and ensuring academic honesty. Support sessions to use the latest service from Turnitin “SIMCHECK” was introduced and is straight forward to use for TMUC staff.

The Academic Committee at TMUC has revised the Turnitin use policy.

Excerpts from the policy are as follows:

SIMCHECK Accounts are only allowed to Programme Leaders. Turnitin feature must not be used for draft assignments, or formative submissions.

SIMCHECK to be used for NCC/ UOL & UH programmes.

Turnitin embedded feature within MS Teams shall only be used for following programmes:

- A. Pearson Higher Nationals
- B. UCA Undergraduate Programmes
- C. UCA Postgraduate

In continuation of the strategies and approach since the outbreak of pandemic in March 2020 and uncertain conditions as the COVID-19 spread spikes again, TMUC will continue to ensure ‘uninterrupted learning’ for all our students across the programmes nationwide.

TMUC has already licensed the MS OFFICE 365 for its enterprise and all academic management and delivery has been digitised through the use of MS TEAMS as a digital learning platform. This includes academic management channels and academic delivery channels for each qualification across the five TMUC Campuses.

The Academic delivery channels enable faculty and students, who all have their individual TMUC logins to conduct and attend online lessons.

The Turnitin facility has been embedded so that faculty and students can generate similarity reports.

To support the T&L process, QAD has successfully digitalized student admission queries through TAWKTO App, as well as the entire registry process called Collaborative Enrolment Sheet. Therefore, most tasks and deliverables can be completed off-site, online.

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
